While in Thailand, I committed to serving two years alongside the poor through incarnational ministry in living among them. I intend to keep alive my network of connections to ministry partners who are in missions world-wide and who intend on serving through missions after college.

This letter is being written a couple of weeks sooner than would be normal. When it leaves the Newark Illinois post office, I expect to be leading a team of seven young short term missionaries into the lowlands north of LaPaz Bolivia. It will be the rainy season, roads will be muddy (where there are roads) and the rivers swollen with rain. Please remember us in prayer. Phil Kittelson will be the leader of the expedition which will total about twenty in all.

Our team will include a medical component with a dentist and doctor in the lineup, as well as youth and children's ministries to numerous, villages in some very remote places. That's where our team comes in. Though our team is young in age, this will be the second or third trip to Bolivia for most of our group.

I look forward to sharing the experience with you in future letters. Just pray that we will be used according to God's will in a country where His light needs to shine.
