**Star Camp** - Thousands of children live on the streets of UlaanBaatar. As an alternative, some of the children live in a shelter that is operated by the government. Each summer, the children are moved to a rural location called Star Camp for two to three months. While their very basic needs are met, there are few programs or activities provided by the government. With the help of ten translators and ten Mongolian teachers, our group will plan and lead activities for five days that will be teach biblical principles, and lift the spirits of the 100 or so children at Star Camp. Our missionaries continue to build strong relationships with the leaders and staff of the government shelter.

**Community Center** - The Community Center is in Ger District #16 of UlaanBaatar. Gers are the traditional round homes of nomadic Mongolia. The Community Center is just what the name implies. It is a central place for educating pre-schoolers and adults, and tutoring for all ages. Bible studies, wedding receptions and almost every kind of social event happens here. We will be with the people who serve at the Community Center as well as the people that are served.

**Desert Rose** - Among the large number of street kids in UlaanBaatar, the most vulnerable are the young girls who live in stairwells of buildings and under the streets. The Desert Rose Shelter For Girls provides a safe place for girls to get clean, sleep, eat and to learn more about God if they choose. We will be involved in several activities that will allow our

**Terelj National Park** - is located a couple hours' drive from the capital city. We expect to stay overnight there, sleeping in gers or tents and will eat traditional Mongolian food including Khorhog. We will spend a good deal of time with the girls from the Desert Rose Shelter, including horseback riding for those who are so inclined.

**Participants need to know** that the conditions for most of this trip would be considered primitive. The Star Camp and ger district have no running water and only pit toilets. There will be a couple of opportunities to shower, but only while in UlaanBaatar. We will live in the ger district without running water.

There will be a **REQUIRED training session** to be held in Norway Illinois, seventy miles southwest of Chicago. The training will be held on **May 1, 2010**. **Additional meetings will be scheduled for June / July**

Estimated cost is based on airfare costs of \$2,200 per person and the final cost of the trip will vary depending on the final airfare cost

Travelers will need a valid passport with at least 6 months before expiration, and check with your doctor concerning recommended immunizations.

\$2,200 is due on May 1, 2010 and the balance is due by July 1, 2010.
